

Health Department Guidelines

for Lemonade Day Stands

Health Department Laws:

Lemonade Stands are not subject to Health Permits; however, they are subject to inspection. Washington and Benton County Health Department have made the follow suggestions for any stand set up on Public Property.

Public Property according to the city: Places of business, Parks, Trails, City side walks

Private Property: Your neighborhood or drive way

Hand washing Facilities are strongly suggested for those who set up on Public property, taken from the County temporary food service guide.

Hand washing Facilities

A convenient hand washing facility shall be available for employee hand washing. This facility shall consist of at least warm water, soap and individual paper towels. Must be convenient and accessible.

As a minimum, the following shall be provided.

Warm water

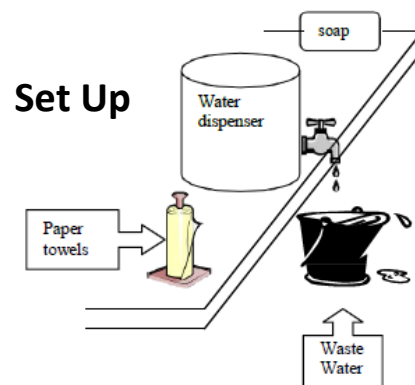
Soap

Individual paper towels

Bucket to collect dirty water

For example, an air pump thermos or jug of warm water with a turn spout may be used to dispense warm water.

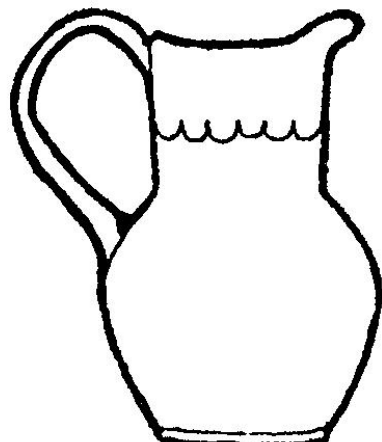
A gravity-flow hand wash station if a plumbed is not available.

Not Approved Water Dispenser for Hand washing

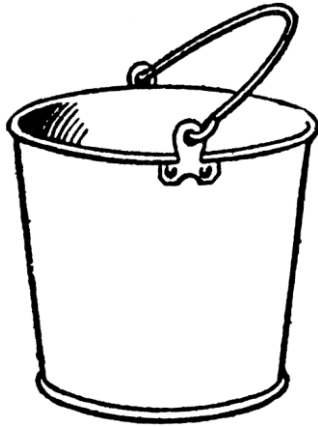
